AND NOW A FEW WORDS FROM MY FOSTER FAMILY...

Newt is one sweet ween! His inability to see and hear has led him to adapt by using touch and smell to map out his world. Because of this, his area needs to be kept clean and clear of danger such as stairs, elevations and roadblocks. He uses memory to maneuver his surroundings. Furniture rearrangement and obstacles should be kept minimal. Since arriving in foster care, Newt has been kept on a schedule with bathroom breaks throughout the day and hasn't had any accidents indoors. He is indifferent to the resident cat and various outdoor creatures. If there is a cat in the home, it must be dog friendly. As for the resident Dachshund, he does not engage very much, however likes to lean his back against her while sitting or napping. This provides comfort for him. He does not require another dog to be in the home. If there is another dog, Newt would benefit with a calmer dog who isn't possessive and doesn't mind learning to be a guide dog and leaning post. Rambunctious, high-energy dogs will not be suitable for Newt. He absolutely loves humans. He considers anyone who will pay attention to him and keep him close by as a friend. He is very trusting and gentle with humans. Because of his inability to move out of the way, a family with children must ensure they are taught to be aware of his presence. Gentil touching and allowing him to smell you on arrival are the best ways for him to know you are present. Newt will go in a crate and remain calm for short periods of time. While inside the crate he will periodically cry, howl or bark. Although these periods don't last long, this could be disruptive for anyone living in an apartment or attached style home. Special consideration of this should be taken if you live in an apartment or attached home, as this behaviour could be disruptive to your neighbours. He is not leash trained and does not understand how to go on walks. We are working with him to teach him how to go on a guided walk. He will be required to be picked up and carried up and down stairs. A solid understanding of Dachshund anatomy should be understood to avoid any long-term health issues such as IVDD. Newt is slightly overweight and is being brought back to a healthier weight. Newt's conditions are a result of unethical breeding. Newt's ideal family would include someone who is home often, and has the ability, time, and patience to care for him.
