Timmy is my name, and loving humans is my game. I'm a wee fella with lots of love to give. I have some anxiety, which is a common issue with my breed. I'm taking medication for my anxiety, but my foster moms are currently weaning me off the medication to see how I do without it. This process will take some time, so patience is needed. I don't tolerate young children as I don't like that level of activity, and when they drop food on the floor, I naturally think that whatever was dropped is for me. I have been fostered with dogs of all ages and sizes, and I like that! Currently I'm in a single dog home and I've become quite attached to my favorite human. I think having another fur sibling would be great for me! I love to go for walks and for outings in the car... as long as I'm with you I'll be happy.

And now a few words from my foster family:

Timmy is a sweet little guy who just wants to be a part of a family. He has been medicated for anxiety for many years and we are currently weaning him down in dose to see how he does. He definitely cannot be crated. Due to his anxiety, he is not allowed to sleep on the big bed, however, he enjoys sleeping on a dog bed on the floor of his fosters' bedroom and this has helped a lot. When his foster human leaves, Timmy will whine and look for his foster human, so good walks and lots of exercise are necessary to help reduce some of his anxiety. He is very highly food-motivated which makes training a breeze. A well-balanced dog buddy would be great for Timmy, if they are a good match. He has not been cat tested but he does have a higher prey drive, so a cat in the home is not recommended. Importantly, Timmy is not a good match for humans under the age of 16.
